This was a game of two halves with Institute so outstanding and completely dominant in the first part of the game. Sadly the fact that we only fielded 10 players took a severe toll on the side as the game progressed and Alsop found second half gaps and managed to score five goals against a very tired Institute. With a full side I doubt if they would have had a 'look in'. Almost at the very beginning Institute should have taken a lead when Smith missed his kick right in front of goal. Turner pulled off a fine interception and sent forward a great long ball to Smith who linked well with Eyo. Stanley was playing a fine defensive role on the left flank. Institute took a deserved lead when Turner sent Eme away with a great pass. EME's centre fooled everyone and the ball 'curled' into the net. Galvin kept our lead intact with a superb save at the other end. Smith now crashed the ball against the post and at this stage it was impossible to tell that Institute only had ten players. Superb build up football saw EME take the ball right up to and around the goalkeeper. He kept his cool and Institute were two goals ahead. The pattern repeated itself, another brave Galvin save and then a switch in play to the other end. Now it was Eyo who played a superb solo run and took the ball right round the defence to put Institute three goals clear. At this stage Alsop were dead and Institute so far ahead that it seemed unlikely that the home team could do anything about the result. But the fact that we were one man short was to have horrific repercussions later on. In the first half EME was brilliant in every aspect of the game. Skill, enthusiasm and determination, all first class. Sadly he had given his all and in the second half he faded out of the game and with ~~his~~ loss of the midfield Alsop came (bounding) back. For 15 minutes we held out. Alsop hit the post and Peters stood out in the back four. Galvin pulled off a brilliant save and Turner cleared off the line. However, once Alsop did manage to get the ball into the net our confidence evaporated. The last 20 minutes were painful as 5 goals 'rained in' on our goalkeeper, their

winning goal being an own goal from the unlucky Turner.

You could sum this game up with a glance at the reliable Crossland on the way off the pitch. He had given everything he had and was only beaten by fatigue in his efforts to cover the gaps left by the absent players. Institute were indeed let down by absent colleagues.

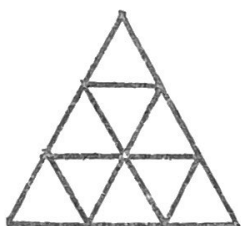

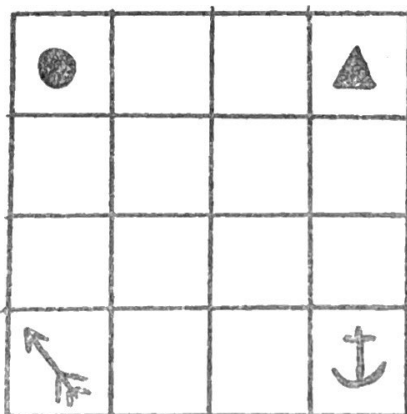

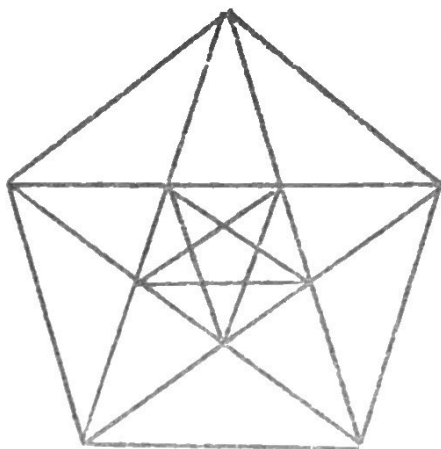
